<b>ON ROPE TEST</b> Climber demonstrates on rope test for body thrust.	Tied in, feet on tree, hands off rope. Must be successful before continuing		106/ Fail Exam
<b>ON ROPE TEST</b> Climber demonstrates on rope test for secured footlock.	Tied in, feet off ground, hands off rope. Must be successful before continuing		106/ Fail Exam

<b>TYING A FIGURE-8</b> Climber demonstrates tying a figure 8 in running end.	Figure-8 stopper knot tied.		15
<b>TIME LIMIT ON TYING IN</b> Climber demonstrates tying the knot within maximum time allowed.	Maximum of 20 minutes to tie-in point. If greater than 20 minutes-Fail exam. (Deduct 101)		106/ Fail Exam
